## **MORE TRAFFIC CAMERAS COMING TO BELTWAY AND TYSONS CORNER**

**TYSONS CORNER** - By summer, 20 portable traffic cameras will be strategically located along the beltway, Dulles Toll Road and on routes 7 and 123 in Tysons Corner as part of the Virginia Department of Transportation's (VDOT) effort to keep traffic moving while beltway high occupancy toll (HOT) lanes and rail to Dulles are under construction.

Three portable cameras were recently placed at the beltway's intersections with Gallows Road, Route 123 and Route 7. The remaining 17 cameras will be placed this summer at major construction points along the beltway, the Dulles Toll Road and Tysons Corner's roadways. The cameras will allow VDOT to monitor traffic conditions and construction activities such as lane closures and traffic shifts, respond quickly to any incidents and re-time traffic signals if needed.

"Before leaving home or the office, motorists will be able to check traffic conditions at [www.511Virginia.org](http://www.511Virginia.org) or at [www.trafficland.com](http://www.trafficland.com)," said J.D. Schneeberger, operations planner for VDOT. "Portable cameras will allow us to easily move them from one location to another, giving VDOT and the public a bird's eye view of both construction activities and traffic hotspots."
